



CALL FOR SUBMISSIONS – JAD 2021

What role does fundamental research play in society? Although the answer to this question might seem obvious to many researchers, at times there seems to be a lacuna preventing science from being perceived as an integral part of social life. How does science analyse and interpret the society in which it operates? How do new methods, technologies, and conceptual approaches allow society to constantly evolve? And at the same time, how do the changes in society push science forward? The 7th Annual PhD Students' Day is aiming to present the research of PhD students through the lens of the many links that bring together science and society.

The research laboratories of the AMU, and the Laboratoire Parole et Langage (LPL) specifically, significantly contribute to this process of tying together science and society. This is reflected, on one hand, through the huge variety of fields of research in which the LPL teams are involved (linguistics, didactics, psychology, neuroscience, computer science, etc.) and, on the other hand, through the collaborations carried out with numerous universities around the world.

As in previous years, all PhD students of the AMU are welcome to present their research at the 7th Annual PhD Students' Day. The JAD encourages not only the presentation of original work, but also the strengthening of communication between AMU PhD students from different fields by providing an opportunity to meet and interact with each other and with other people involved in scientific life (such as students, researchers, engineers) in the LPL and the AMU.

Submissions, both for completed and ongoing projects, from all fields of research represented at AMU are accepted as long as they are relevant to the topic of this PhD Students' Day: Science and Society. This topic is intended to be open to interpretation; a non-exhaustive list of possible aspects reflecting the interaction between science and society is provided below as a guideline. However, every student is welcome to submit a presentation that links their research with the general topic of this year's JAD.

All submissions must include a PhD student enrolled in the AMU as a first author (it is not necessary to be affiliated with the LPL). The presentations can be made either in English or French and the abstracts should be submitted in the respective language.

There are two possible formats of presentation:

- 20 minutes oral presentation followed by 10 minutes discussion
- Poster session

TOPIC OF THE PhD STUDENTS' DAY: SCIENCE & SOCIETY

During the JAD PhD students will present their work with respect to the ways their research influences or is influenced by the society. To provide you with some guidelines we suggest here a selection of topics ranging from experimental design to the application and perception of scientific advances in the society, making it possible to formulate ideas of some of the many links that connect research and community:

- The impact that innovative methods, technologies, and tools have on society (in pedagogy, didactics, rehabilitation, etc.).
- Methods (tools and software) used for data collection and analysis.
- From data collection to analysis: applications and discoveries of social mechanisms.
- Ethical aspect of research in human and social sciences (RGPD, CPP).
- The nature and function of metadata
- The possibilities and limitations of applying open science principles in research.
- The perception and exploitation of scientific discoveries and advances in media.

ORAL PRESENTATION AND POSTER SUBMISSIONS:

Submissions must be made before the **21st of December 2020**, by sending an e-mail to the following address: jad@lpl-aix.fr

All submissions should follow the abstract template (attached to this call) and must include:



- Name of the author and their supervisor(s)
- Laboratory of affiliation
- Title of the paper
- Keywords (up to 5)
- Abstract (up to 500 words)
- List of references (up to 10)
